## Overview

The mission of Local Reentry Councils (LRCs) is to provide transition services for ex-offenders returning to the community during or after serving active prison or community correction sentences. This report provides an overview of the clients served at Guilford Local Reentry Council from January 1, 2021-September 30, 2021, as well as the services provided to these clients and their outcomes.

Note that numbers in this report may be slightly higher based on multiple entries for clients who returned for additional services or may be lower due to missing data.






### Dismissal Outcomes




### Age Range at Enrollment






### Marital Status at Enrollment






# Activities
