

THIS CONTRACT is hereby made, entered into, and effective as of January 1 2019, by and between GUILFORD COUNTY, on behalf of its Emergency Services and Department of Health and Human Services/Division of Public Health, a body politic and corporate of the State of North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the “COUNTY,” and the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, hereinafter referred to as the “PROVIDER,” and also collectively referred to as the “Parties.”

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a CONTRACT finalized on December 12, 2017, whereby the PROVIDER is providing a post reversal follow up program for persons suffering from substance use disorder, specifically targeted at opioid mortality;

WHEREAS, the initial Contract may be revised or modified with a written Contract executed by both Parties; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties now wish to modify the terms of the Contract; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties mutually agree that the following changes are hereby made to the initial Contract as follows:

CHANGES:

Section 1.A. Supervision will shift from the Centers for Housing and Community Studies to the School of Social Work under the direction of the Chair, Melissa Floyd-Pickard, PhD. Executive oversight will remain within the Office of Research and Engagement and Vice Chancellor, Terri L. Shelton, PhD.

Section 1.C.d. Executive oversight will change to UNCG Chair of School of Social Work or designee

Section 1.E. Preliminary budget will be revised to reflect current YTD spending, as well as allocations of the new grants. All amounts will be considered maximum exposure, and the COUNTY reserves the right to amend the budget as required for program sustainability.

Section 1.R. The COUNTY agrees to extend the rights of vehicle operations to other UNCG employees, but they all must be vetted through current COUNTY risk management processes.

ADDITIONS:

Section 1.V. Sub-recipient requirements:

In accordance with OMB Circular 2 CFR 200 Uniform Guidance, GUILFORD COUNTY is required to monitor the activities of grant funding passed through to sub-recipients as necessary to

ensure that federal and state funds are used for authorized purposes and that performance goals are achieved based on laws, regulations, contracts and grant requirements.

The AGENCY shall have an annual audit of its financial records and operations performed by an independent certified public accountant with a copy of the current audit and current management letter being submitted to the GUILFORD COUNTY Finance Department within 30 days after the audit report or nine (9) months of the AGENCY'S fiscal year end, whichever occurrence is first. A copy of the financial records and operations of the AGENCY shall be provided at the COUNTY'S discretion. The COUNTY shall be entitled to audit the financial records and operations of the AGENCY.

The COUNTY reserves the right to perform additional monitoring (both during and after the grant period) of the AGENCY's use of funds through reporting, site visits, regular contact, or other means to provide assurance that the AGENCY administers Federal funds in compliance with laws, rules, and the provisions of grant agreements and also, that performance goals are achieved.

PRIOR AGREEMENTS. All other provisions of the initial Contract and subsequent modifications and revisions, are hereby ratified and shall continue in full force and effect without change, unless and until revised upon mutual written Agreement of the Parties, or terminated as provided herein.
