The Child Support department has collected & disbursed a total of \$24,443,612.10 as of March 31st, 2025, which is 73.21% of our annual collection goal for the current fiscal year.

Child Support has served 1,996 walk-in customers and 27,837 customers by telephone for Fiscal Year 2025.

The Child Support Department is exceeding the 75% Performance Measurement in all seven self-assessment scoring 75.35% and higher.
