The Guilford County Sheriff's Office is seeking a JAG equipment grant to purchase a K9 dog and K9 training for the K9. The K9 and K9 training will enhance the level of drug identification, missing person identification and officer safety while providing law enforcement services. We are also seeking JAG Equipment grant to purchase masks and diving gear for our Undercover Recovery Team. The masks and gear will enhance our capability to recover evidence, and/or missing persons during investigations.

The K9, K9 training, and diving gear will enhance the magnitude at which we can identify drugs/hazardous materials , identify missing persons and improve officer safety while providing law enforcement services of all Sheriff's officers. In an era of constant reports of officer safety issues as well as officer fatalities, missing person reports and drug operations, a reliable K9 as well as masks/diving gear is at the cornerstone of officer survival and citizen safety. This grant will assist this agency in providing necessary equipment for law enforcement officers.
