The North Carolina Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts, organized in 1944 is made up of 96 local soil and water conservation districts in North Carolina. The Association is a 501(c)(3) organization.

Local soil and water conservation districts provide technical and financial assistance to landowners through voluntary, incentive based programs; focusing on natural resource concerns such as erosion and sediment control, nutrient management, proper storage and utilization of animal waste, water use efficiency, increasing surface storage of water for agricultural uses, and others. Local soil and water conservation districts also sponsor a number of conservation education programs for elementary and middle school age children such as poster, essay, and speech contests and sponsor a state-wide Envirothon – competition for middle and high school teams in the areas of forestry, soils, wildlife, aquatics, and current environmental events.

In 2019, the Association will sponsor the North American Envirothon. This is a competition of the best of the best Envirothon teams from across North America. These teams have worked within their local Envirothon programs to earn the honor to represent their state, territory or province at this event. Soil and Water Conservation Districts from across NC have already started pledging their support and all will be encouraged through our fund raising campaign lasting to the event.
