MINUTES OF BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GUILFORD COUNTY

Greensboro, North Carolina October 17, 2024

The Board of County Commissioners met in a duly noticed regular meeting on October 17, 2024 at 5:30 p.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room, 301 W. Market St., Greensboro; North Carolina.

Chairman Alston introduced Gayle Coston, United States Army Veteran, who would lead the Pledge of Allegiance following the invocation.

Board Chaplin Ben Chavis offered the innovation.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Ms. Coston led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Alston welcomed those present and called the meeting to order at 5:34 p.m.

Chairman Alston took a moment of personal privilege to speak to the recent closure of the Interactive Resource Center's (IRC) 24/7 dayroom center operations. He addressed the pilot program's resource strains and staffing challenges. He spoke to safe sheltering plan development, and recognized County Manager Michael Halford.

Halford shared his gratitude of the IRC for trying to extend services and attempt the pilot program. He noted that we will continue to support clients through our services departments. He noted that the Board allocated funds for the 24/7 services. He shared that with the recent announcement of discontinuation of services, we can only reimburse expenses through the conclusion of the program.

IV. SPEAKERS FROM THE FLOOR

Cheri Pikett, Summerfield resident, shared that she is a retired nurse and spoke to the Minority Diabetes Program. She referenced potential causes and suggested mitigation efforts.

Shelly noted that as we kick off Operation Green Light, we focus on how we provide services to our veterans, how we treat our veterans, and how we pay respect to our veterans. He noted that this will be our third year participating in Operation Green Light. He thanked the Board for their sincerity and care for our veterans. He noted that our federal partners are currently here in Guilford County for a Veterans Benefits Live event until this weekend to expedite processing for veterans' services.

VIII. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES UPDATE

A. 2024-428 DHHS UPDATES: PUBLIC HEALTH

Ramachandran provided a public health update on respiratory viruses in the community. She shared that since COVID-19 we have new surveillance techniques for monitoring and tracking.

Ramachandran reviewed tools used to track respiratory viruses such as Emergency Department visits and provided current data from 2020-2024.

Ramachandran provided an update on wastewater monitoring. She noted that North Carolina has a total of thirty-seven (37) sites in the wastewater monitoring network. She noted viral particles are shed in human waste and can be tracked through the wastewater monitoring program to provide a better epidemiological picture of geographical outbreaks.

Ramachandran shared a brief update on the COVID-19 revenue received in FY23-24 and recognized Louise Baldwin, Public Health Agency Business Manager.

Baldwin noted that Guilford County Public Health was awarded over \$2M in funding to essential services to address the impacts of COVID-19. She reviewed key uses of the funding and revenue breakdowns.

Commissioner Cashion questioned the number of school health nurses. Baldwin noted that we were able to use these funds to cover the work and expenses of eight (8) of our existing school nurse positions.

Commissioner Cashion questioned the graph and asked if there were any concerns.

Ramachandran noted that the graph shows data through August and to date the viral partials per person have seen a marked decrease.

Vice Chairwoman Foster questioned the vaccination protocols.

Ramachandran noted that nationwide we are seeing a drop in vaccinations. She shared that Public Health is now working under the guidance of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to normalize vaccinations.

Halford noted that there has been great support from the county staff and teams who have been transitioning in and out of Western North Carolina to provide support for impacted residents in those communities. He spoke to teams from the Sheriff's Office, Animal Services, Inspections, Environmental Health, Social Services, among many other departments.

Halford noted that the State Nursing Director of Education shared their appreciation to the quality of public health nurses who have been deployed.

There were no comments from the County Attorney.

XII. COMMENTS FROM COMMISSIONERS

Commissioner Gray-Hill shared his attendance at the State of the County (SOTC) Address. He thanked staff for their work on the event and all the programs lead by the Board and county teams. He announced that early voting began this week and encouraged everyone to get out and vote. He noted that this is his one-year anniversary serving on the Board and he appreciates the opportunity.

Commissioner Murphy echoed kudos on the SOTC event and to Chairman Alston for leading the report out to the community. She shared her attendance of fall festivals, the Triad Real Estate and Building Industry Coalition (TREBIC) event and enjoyed spending time with the community.

Commissioner Cooke echoed congratulations to staff and the Chairman for the SOTC event. She shared her first North Carolina Association of County Commissioners (NCACC) board meeting. She shared that in the legislative goals process, many if not all, of the County's items are moving forward in the process. She recognized the FJC's Catherine Johnson and Sonya Desai who just completed the Chicago Marathon this past week.

Commissioner Cashion congratulated Chairman Alston for hosting this year's SOTC. She shared that she also attended the NCACC Board of Directors event with other members of this Board. She shared while our legislative agenda items are moving forward some of them are being revised more broadly so we may need to consider monitoring so that we don't lose the County's voice. She shared her recent attendance welcoming the new Director of the Carolina Theater.

Commissioner Jones shared that he was unable to attend the October 3rd meeting as a new health center was being named in honor of his grandfather-in-law. He shared his attendance of a recent community event hosted by Turning Everything Around that had exceptional attendance. He thanked the many county departments who take time outside of normal business hours to be in the community and represent the county well in community outreach efforts.

She announced that next week is the annual International Furniture Market and encouraged everyone to come out.

Chairman Alston thanked the County staff for all their work in preparing the Annual State of the County Address. He thanked the County Commissioners for their ongoing work as a true team. He shared that we have much more to accomplish as a team in the future.
