

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING REALLOCATION OF HOME INVESTMENT PROGRAM
FUNDING TO THE CITY OF GREENSBORO FOR AFFORDABLE, PERMANENT
SUPPORTIVE HOUSING**

WHEREAS, \$125,580 of federal HOME Investment Partnerships Program funding is available from Guilford County's 2018 Program Year allocation for the purpose of increasing the availability of affordable housing as part of the Greensboro and Guilford County HOME Consortium;

WHEREAS, the HOME Program is a procedure established for the use of funds provided by Title II of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, as amended, to carry out multi-year housing strategies;

WHEREAS, Guilford County and the City of Greensboro entered into a Joint Cooperative Agreement as of July 1, 2025, as Participating Governments under the HOME Investment Partnerships Program, which modified a previous agreement entered on June 29, 2004, for the purpose of operating a HOME Program;

WHEREAS, the Greensboro City Council at its January 20, 2026, regular meeting approved the creation of 10 affordable, permanent supportive housing units at 817 Summit Avenue to be known as Fourteen Friends Place;

WHEREAS, the recommendation is to reallocate Guilford County's 2018 Program Year consortium funds of \$125,580 to the City of Greensboro as HOME Investment Partnerships Program Consortium administrator;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF GUILFORD COUNTY:

That it authorizes the reallocation of its \$125,580 share of 2018 Program Year federal HOME Investment Partnerships Program Consortium funds to the City of Greensboro as HOME Consortium administrator, including compliance responsibilities related to the use of these dollars.
