A. CONTRACTS

DHHS - CONTINUUM OF CARE (COC) PROGRAM UPDATE AND 1. 2021-466 CONTRACT WITH PARTNERS ENDING HOMELESSNESS Background: During the November 2, 2020 Guilford County Board of Commissioners Work Session, Commissioners approved Guilford County assuming the role of Collaborative Applicant for the Guilford County Continuum of Care (CoC); authorize staff to take all necessary measures to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the CoC and Partners Ending Homelessness to facilitate the transition; to take all reasonable and necessary actions to file a new Collaborative Applicant profile and complete the CoC program registration in esnaps; and establish a position to help coordinate program activities. During this meeting it was also discussed that Partners Ending Homelessness would continue to be the Administrative Agent effective January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 and the MOU was approved to be signed.

A grant application was submitted to Housing and Urban Development (HUD) from Partners Ending Homelessness for Continuum of Care planning activities. Now that Guilford County has been legally identified as the collaborative applicant, PEH can no longer draw down direct funding from HUD. Guilford County, as the Collaborative Applicant will be responsible for drawing down funding from HUD for required COC activities.

Notification was received effective January 1, 2022, PEH will no longer be able to receive funding directly from HUD for COC planning activities. It will become the responsibility of Guilford County to receive funding and distribute to PEH for reimbursements of activities related to the COC.

A new contract is required to allow PEH to become a sub-recipient of HUD funding through Guilford County as the Collaborative Applicant, associated with grants designated for COC planning activities.

The total amount of the 2020 HUD planning grant is \$69,197. PEH will be drawing down funding directly from HUD through December 2021. Guilford County will be responsible for submitting for funding against the grant based on reimbursement documentation received

	from PEH on a monthly basis. The contract will be for six months for up to half of the grant total, which is \$34,598.50.

2.	<u>2021-475</u>	DHHS-PUBLIC HEALTH DIVISION: COVID-19 EMERGENCY HOUSING CONTRACT AMENDMENT WITH GLOBAL MANAGEMENT
	<u>Background:</u>	Guilford County contracts with Global Management Corporation to provide emergency housing for citizens who are ordered to quarantine and/or isolate as result of the COVID-19 pandemic. In order to continue to provide emergency housing, the DHHS-Public Health division must maintain access to a block of rooms to house patients. DHHS-Public Health requests to amend its contract with Global Management, which will reduce the number of blocked rooms reserved from 35 to 20 at the current room rate of \$65.00 plus tax per night. This amendment would extend the terms of the contract through March 31, 2022 at a cost of \$143,648.48, which would be
		covered through previously awarded and adopted COVID-19 funding; brining the total estimated cost to \$594,349 for FY 21/22.
	<u>Requested Action:</u>	Approve an amendment, in substantial form, to the price only contract with Global Management Corporation in the amount of \$143,649 with an effective date of January 1, 2022 through March 31, 2022 for emergency housing services. Funding for contract approved from previously awarded and adopted COVID-19 funds, for an estimated total of \$594,349 during the current Fiscal Year.

3.	<u>2021-479</u>	UNITED HEALTHCARE (UHC) STOP LOSS COVERAGE FOR 2022 PLAN YEAR
	<u>Background:</u>	Guilford County sponsors a self-funded health insurance plan for eligible employees and retirees. This plan covers claims up to \$425,000. A separate "stop loss plan" reimburses the County for claims that exceed \$425,000 per individual claimant. The County's consultant, USI, requested bids from eight (8) stop loss carriers and received bids from two (2) for plan year 2022 coverage. United Healthcare (the current carrier with a rate of \$46.13 per member per month) and one other company, Sun Life, were the only bidders who responded. While Sun Life offers a better fixed monthly renewal rate (\$42.14 for Sun Life vs. UHC's \$69.20), their bid requires the exclusion of one (1) high cost-claimant from coverage. The claimant Sun Life proposes to exclude has projected 2021 gross claims costs of \$2,150,000, of which \$1,755,000 would ordinarily be paid by stop loss coverage.
	<u>Requested Action:</u>	The UHC 2021 contract contained a rate cap of 50% for the 2022 plan year, and the proposed UHC contract for 2022 includes a max rate cap of 50% for 2023 as well. In contrast, Sun Life's bid also gives it the option of expanding the one (1) claimant exclusion to three (3) at renewal. As information, the County currently has three (3) claimants who have met the stop loss deductible for 2021. Authorize staff to enter into a price only contract with United Healthcare (UHC) for stop loss coverage for the 2022 plan year in the amount of \$69.20 per member per month to be effective January 1, 2022 for a term of one (1) year at an annual cost not expected to exceed \$2,288,582, with an optional one year renewal with same or better rate cap.

	<u>Background:</u>	Medicare-eligible retirees who meet the required criteria are currently covered by a Medicare Advantage plan that costs a total of \$231.80 monthly. The County contributes \$203.12 on behalf of 30-year retirees. For 2022, the total monthly premium will remain the same. The County contribution should remain constant at \$203.12, with the retiree paying the balance, as has been the County's practice since the 2014 plan year. See attached plan summary.
	Requested Action.	Authorize staff to renew contract with United Healthcare to provide Medicare-eligible qualified retirees with the current Medicare Advantage plan, with no plan changes. Approve a rate of \$231.80 with the County contribution remaining the same at a maximum of \$203.12 per retiree.

	<u>Background:</u>	On September 17th 2020 the Board authorized staff to move forward with construction of a 40,000 square foot 2-story building with a total project budget not to exceed \$15,000,000. At the time, the project ordinance was not adjusted to reflect the \$15 million approved project budget. The current balance in the project is \$1,883,500. This agenda item increases the Law Enforcement Administration Building Renovation capital project ordinance by \$13,116,500 to reflect the currently approved \$15,000,000 project budget. The additional funds will come from 2017 and 2019 two-thirds bonds proceeds in accordance with the County's capital investment plan. This will allow the design work to continue and final cost estimates to be completed. Pending approval and issuance of two-thirds bonds in early 2022, the project ordinance will be adjusted by an estimated \$8,900,000 to reflect the most up to date estimate of \$23.9 million.
