A. BUDGET AMENDMENTS

1. 2022-109 RE-APPROPRIATE 2021 GC STOP GRANT FUNDS

Background:

The Guilford County Sheriff's Office was awarded 2021 GC STOP grant funding in the amount of \$478,031 to assist justice served individuals in connecting to needed treatments, harm reduction programs and other support services upon release. The Sheriff's Office contracts with UNC-Greensboro to provide services through the GC STOP program and grant funding will be used towards a portion of the salaries and fringe benefits for Deputy Sheriffs who currently work collaboratively with the STOP program to provide assistance, oversight and education.

The Board of Commissioners previously approved this grant and associated positions at the 6/17/2021 Board Meeting. Due to system and account issues, the revenues were deferred from FY21 to FY22 due to the timing of the original grant receipt, near the close of FY21.

Funding will also be used to fund existing grant programs (Pretrial Diversion Court Advocate and Linkage Coordinator) within the Sheriff's Office that will also collaborate with the GC STOP Program. Additionally, grant funding will be used to cover UNC-Greensboro's negotiated indirect cost rate (\$13,643) and will be used towards the purchase of 3,500 doses of Naloxone (\$202,063) for program participants.

Requested Action:

Approve budget amendment to appropriate 2021 GC STOP grant funding in the amount of \$478,031; increase Federal/State Revenue by \$478,031 and increase the FY 2020-21 Law Enforcement budget by the same amount to fund the program including: existing grant positions, UNCG Administrative costs and purchase of 3,500 doses of Naloxone for program participants.

2. 2022-106 DHHS - PUBLIC HEALTH DIVISION - BUDGET AMENDMENT: FAMILY PLANNING ADDITIONAL \$15,000

Background: The U. S. Department of Health and Human Services awarded the

North Carolina Family Planning Program, additional one time Title X funding to support enhancement of Title X Family Planning Services. Public Health has been awarded an additional \$15,000 in Title X funding to expand the Regional Vasectomy Program and provide an additional 25 vasectomies between December 1, 2021 and March 31, 2022. The additional award will allow Public Health to provide a total of 83 vasectomies at a cost of \$600.00 per procedure for FY21-22. Public Health contracts with various regional medical offices to provide the vasectomies at a reduce cost to the participant.

Requested Action: Approve an increase of \$15,000 in Federal/State Revenues and

increase the FY21-22 Department of Health and Human Services - Public Health division by the same amount to reflect funds awarded

by North Carolina Family Planning Program.

APPROVE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITIES OF GREENSBORO, NC; HIGH POINT, NC AND THE COUNTY OF GUILFORD, NC- RECEIPT OF THE 2021 JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT

Background:

The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) program is administered through the Bureau of Justice Assistance. This grant is a joint application between the Cities of Greensboro, High Point and Guilford County. This grant may be used for various criminal justice purposes to enhance public safety. The 2021 award allocation for the Guilford County Sheriff's Office is \$73,713.40.

The Guilford County Sheriff's Office is requesting this award be appropriated to the FY 2021-21 Law Enforcement budget to replace two (2) fully marked Dodge Charger patrol cars, including: decals, door panels, window guards and prisoner petitions.

Requested Action:

Approve an interlocal agreement, in substantial form, with the City of Greensboro and the City of High Point towards joint application and award of the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) program. Approve an increase of \$73,714 in Federal/State Revenues and increase the FY 2021-22 Law Enforcement budget by the same amount to reflect receipt of Guilford County's allocation of the 2021 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG), that will be used towards the replacement of two (2) fully marked patrol vehicles for the Sheriff's Office.

2. 2022-113 LIMITED USE AGREEMENT WITH U.S. MARSHAL'S SERVICE FOR

JUVENILE DETENTION CENTER

Background: Guilford County recommends entering into a limited use

intergovernmental agreement with the US Marshal's Service for the custody and care of federal juvenile detainees in the Guilford County Juvenile Detention Center. The agreement covers a maximum of 150 detainment days at a rate of \$244.00 per day, resulting in total

revenue to the county of \$36,600.

Requested Action: Approve, in substantial form, an intergovernmental agreement with

the United States Marshal's Service (USMS) in the amount of

\$36,600 to be effective October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022 for a term of one (1) year and approve an increase of \$36,600 in

User Charges and increase the FY 2021-22 Juvenile Detention budget by the same amount to reflect anticipated expenses and revenues

related to the custody and care of federal juvenile detainees.

2. 2022-111 DHHS-DSS MANDATED PERFORMANCE MEASURES

Background:

Guilford County signed an annual written agreement with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services for all social services programs, excluding medical assistance (Medicaid). This agreement required Social Services to comply with meeting certain performance and growth measures.

This presentation will be provided on a monthly basis to keep Guilford County's Board of County Commissioners informed of Guilford's progress. The attached results represent data for the month of October and November 2021.

Energy Programs

- County will process 95% of Crisis Intervention Program (CIP) applications, with no heat or cooling sources, within 1 business day from the date of application or date all verification is received, whichever comes first.
- County will process 95% of Crisis Intervention Program (CIP) applications, that have heat or cooling source with past due or final notice, within 2 business days from the date of application or date all verification is received, whichever comes first.
 - ** Dear County Director letter from Jan. 13th 2021extended processing times for LIEAP. The processing time was adjusted from 2 to 10 business days. An enhancement request has been submitted to NC FAST to update the processing time frames in system. Until this change is complete NC Fast will show LIEAP applications as overdue**

Work First

- County will process 95% Work First applications within 45 days
- · County will process 95% Work First re-certifications no later than the last day of the month

Food Nutrition Services

· County will process 95% of expedited FNS applications within 4 calendars of date of application

- County will process 95% of regular FNS applications within 25 days from the date of application
- County will ensure that 95 % of FNS re-certifications are processed timely
- County will ensure that 90 % of Program Integrity claims are established within 180 days of discovery

Adult Protective Services - APS

- County will complete 95% of APS evaluations involving allegations of abuse or neglect within 30 days
- County will complete 85% of APS evaluations involving allegations of exploitation within 45 days

Child Welfare

To date, data from the state still remains unvalidated and therefore an accurate report cannot be presented.

Although Medical Assistance programs are not included in the agreement, Medicaid benchmarks and monthly timeliness will be reported on a monthly basis with data extracted from the monthly Medicaid Report Card. Included in this report are timeliness rates for Medicaid applications for the months of October and November 2021. Re-certification timeliness rates are not yet validated.

Requested Action: Receive monthly data regarding the thirteen mandated performance measures as outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding between Guilford DHHS-Social Services and NC DHHS.

#21-10-GCPL-09184 TO AMEND ARTICLE 9.3 FLOOD DAMAGE
PREVENTION TO AMEND THE NO-FILL IN FLOODPLAIN PROVISION
TO ALLOW FILL FOR RESTORATION OF NATURAL FLOODPLAIN
FUNCTIONS AND RELATED CLARIFICATIONS & FORMATTING
REVISIONS

Background:

The intent of the proposed text amendment is to provide an exclusion to the no-fill provision in Article 9.3 to allow minor filling in the Special Flood Hazard Area (an area which is subject to flood events equal to or surpassing the 1% annual chance flood) where needed to protect or restore natural floodplain functions, such as for part of a stream restoration project.

The amendment language was derived in collaboration with the County's assigned FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) Community Rating System (CRS) Specialist, the CRS technical advisor subcontracted by FEMA, and the NC Department of Public Safety's National Flood Insurance Planner. Clarifications related to the no-fill provision and formatting revisions to ordinance section numbering also are included in the proposed text amendment.

Staff recommends approval. At its December 8, 2021 Regular meeting, the Planning Board recommended unanimously (8-0) that the text amendment (as presented) be forwarded to the Guilford County Board of Commissioners for a public hearing and approval. [Members Present: Mr. Apple; Mr. Craft; Mr. Stalder; Mr. Donnelly; Mr. Gullick; Mrs. McKinley; Ms. Buchanan; and Chair Frankie Jones. Absent: Dr Gathers].

Consistency with Adopted Plans: The proposed text amendment is consistent with the following goal of the *Guilford County Comprehensive Plan*:

Natural, Historic, and Cultural Resources Element - Goal #1: "To seek a balance between the built environment and the protection and preservation of the County's natural, historic, and cultural resources through prudent management, public education, participation and outreach, appropriate regulations and enforcement, and active partnerships with stakeholders."

Reasonable and in the Public Interest: The recommended action is reasonable and in the public interest given that it will allow for more appropriately designed environmental restoration projects in or near floodplains, such as stream restoration projects, while adding no new restrictions to development in or near floodplains.

Requested Action: Hold a public hearing and adopt Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) Text Amendment Case #21-10-GCPL-09184 (as presented/attached herein) that amends Article 9.3 Flood Damage Prevention which changes the no-fill provision to allow fill in the floodplain for restoration of natural floodplain functions and related clarifications and formatting revisions.

B. 2022-112 HOLD PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECODIFICATION OF GUILFORD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES

Background:

Guilford County currently maintains its codified ordinances on the Municode software platform. In conjunction with the Unified Development Ordinance UDO project, the county will be moving away from Municode and will list its codified ordinances on EnCode Plus. EnCode Plus is a subsidiary of Municode and offers advanced tools to support planning and development ordinances while meeting all of the expectations for online access to the general code. The new tool allows integration with our GIS technology for mapping and visualization of land use requirements and zoning regulations and offers opportunity for expansion to allow users to submit projects online and check their status.

Part of the re-launch of the codes includes consolidation of the two separately maintained sections back into one code. The public hearing and authorization to consolidate the codes back into one document is the last step in the project for a centralized and unified Code of Ordinances which will now be easily accessible to the public; meeting the Board's goals of improved transparency.

Requested Action:

Approve consolidation of the Guilford County Unified Development Ordinance back into Chapter 15, replacing existing language of Chapter 15 Article II section 15-56 of the County's General Code of Ordinances; and authorize staff to proceed with recodificiation of the

section.
