B. 2022-397 INCREASING THE AVAILABILITY OF FOSTER FAMILIES FOR

CHILDREN IN NEED

<u>Background:</u> During the July 29, 2022 work session, representatives from

Children's Home Society (CHI) presented on their ARPA Request for Information (RFI) submission to "Increase the Availability of Foster Families for Children in Need." CHS has requested up to \$350,000 over two (2) years to recruit, train and license foster families to meet the needs of children referred by Guilford County DHHS-DSS. To meet current demands, CHS has a goal of licensing

an additional 150 foster families within Guilford County.

Requested Action: Approve the use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to

enter into a sub-award agreement with Children's Home Society (CHS) to recruit, train and license foster families and authorize any

necessary budget transfers.

C. 2022-400 FJC/DSS PROTECTIVE SERVICES TEAM

Background: During the Board's July 29, 2022 work session, FJC and DHHS-DSS

staff presented their ARPA RFI submission on a DHHS-DSS specialty team designed specifically for the FJC to address the complex challenges of vulnerable families living in Guilford County. Collaboratively, the departments have requested \$1,772,220 through 2026 to hire eight (8) staff members in the areas of Child Protective Services (CPS) and Adult Protective Services (APS) in Greensboro and High Point. The eight (8) positions on the specialty team include:

Five (5) Dual CPS/APS Investigators

Two (2) Social Worker III's (Administrative and Intake Support)

One (1) Supervisor

Requested Action: Approve the use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding

towards the addition of eight (8) positions, to include: five (5) dual CPS/APS investigators, two (2) Social Worker III's and one (1) supervisor, to develop a specialty DHHS-DSS/FJC Protective Services team, and authorize all necessary budget transfers.

D. 2022-403 FOOD SECURITY PROGRAM

Background: During the Board's July 29, 2022 work session, Cooperative

Extension staff presented their ARPA RFI proposal to develop a county-wide plan to coordinate data-sharing and communication that would align resources for food security within Guilford County. The proposal has received commitments of monetary and programmatic support from community partners, contingent upon county funding.

E. 2022-401 EMT/PARAMEDIC ACADEMY EXPANSION AND FIRE ACADEMY

LAUNCH

Background: During the Board's July 29, 2022 work session, Emergency Services

staff presented their ARPA RFI submission requesting \$400,000 towards expansion of Guilford County's EMT/Paramedic Academy and \$1,125,000 to launch a Fire Academy, for a total of \$1,525,000 in ARPA funding through 2026. These academies will enable Emergency Services to attract and retain staff in critical services.

Requested Action: Approve the use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to

launch a Guilford County Fire Academy and expand the Guilford County EMT/Paramedic Academy, and authorize all necessary

budget transfers.
