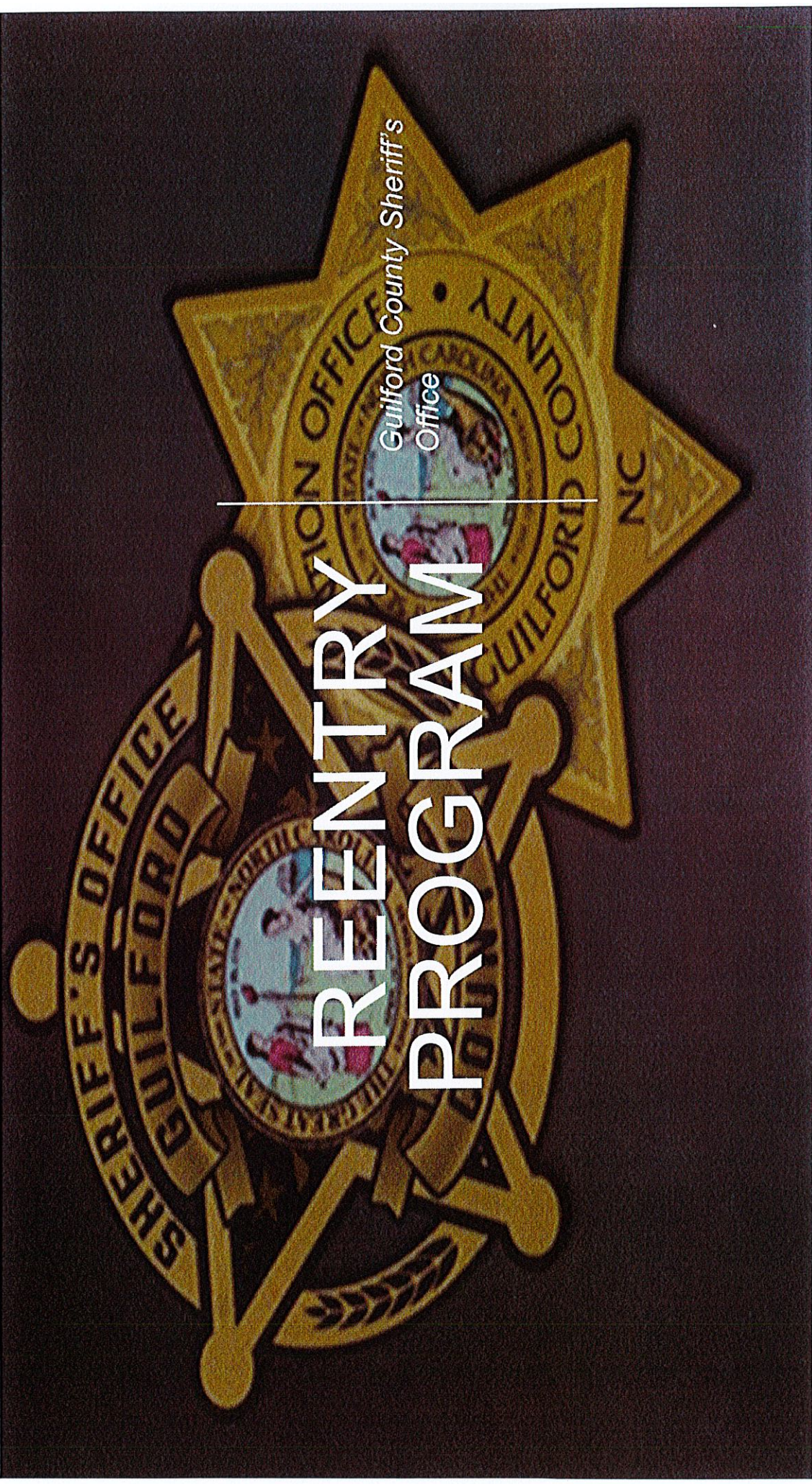

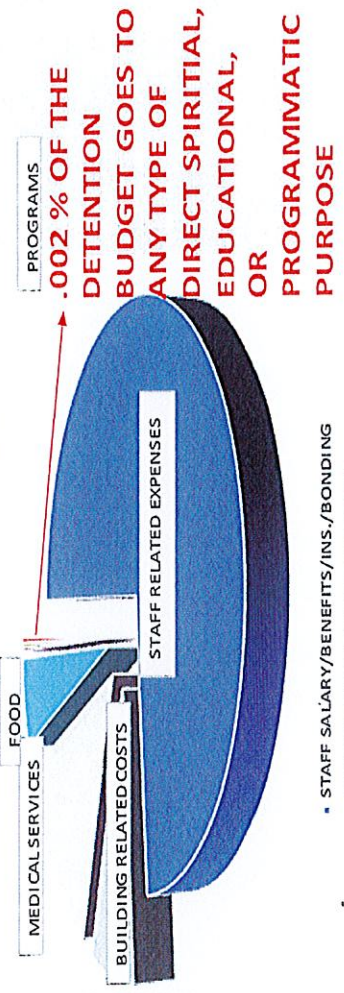

WHAT IS REENTRY?



This year more than 20,000 state inmates returned from Prison to local communities.



This year in Guilford County alone, more than 17,000 men and women were released from the Greensboro and High Point Detention Centers.



Ignoring the needs of this population = high rates of recidivism.



The Reentry process may actually begin while the person is still in custody-this process consists of a needs assessment and action plan that addresses needs or barriers which prevent them from successful reintegration into the community.



Reentry assists the justice served individual to find resources and services to address core factors that contribute to recidivism.

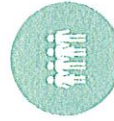

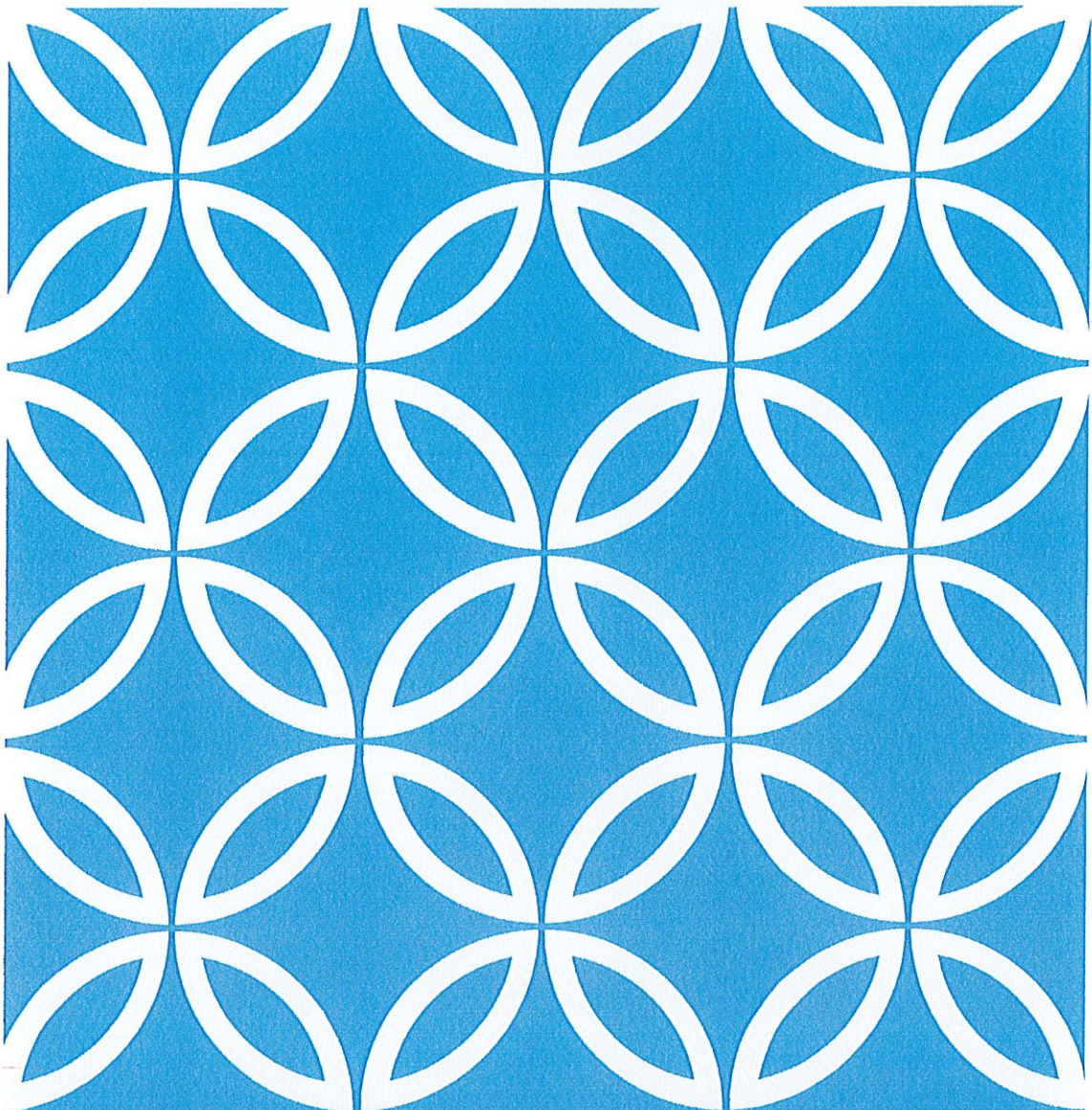

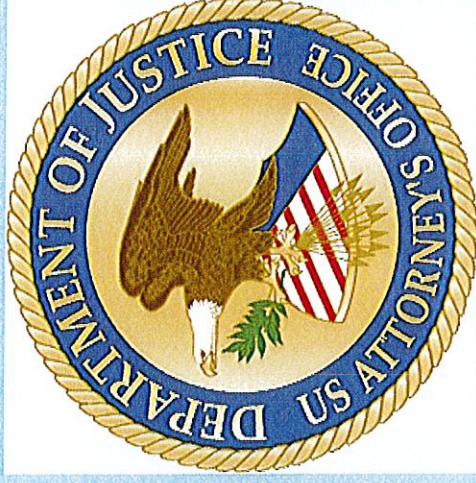

STATES AREN'T ALONE IN THE PUSH FOR REENTRY

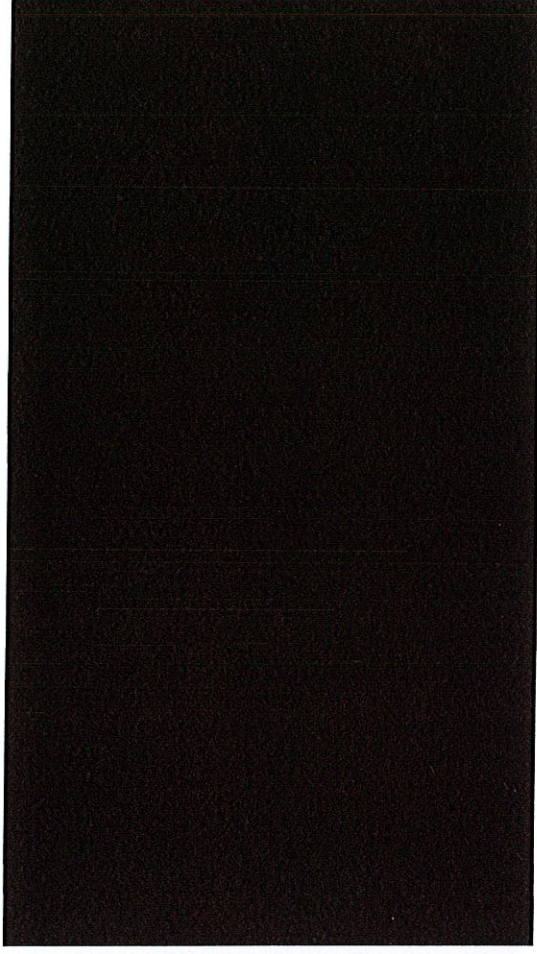

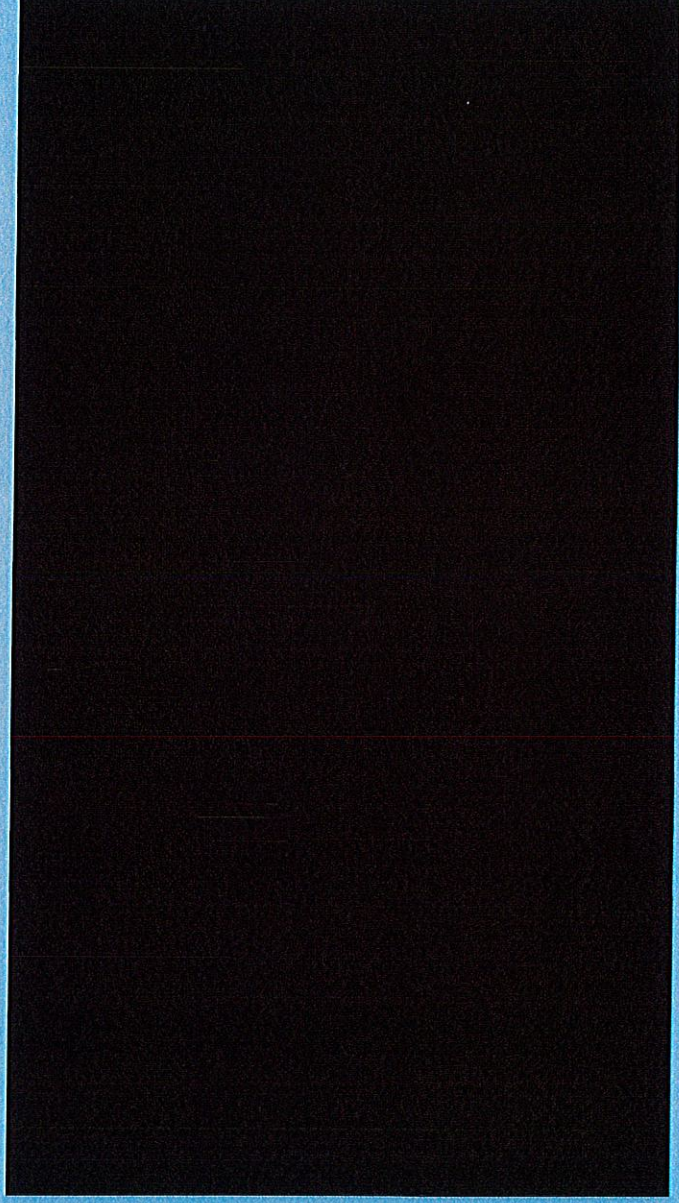

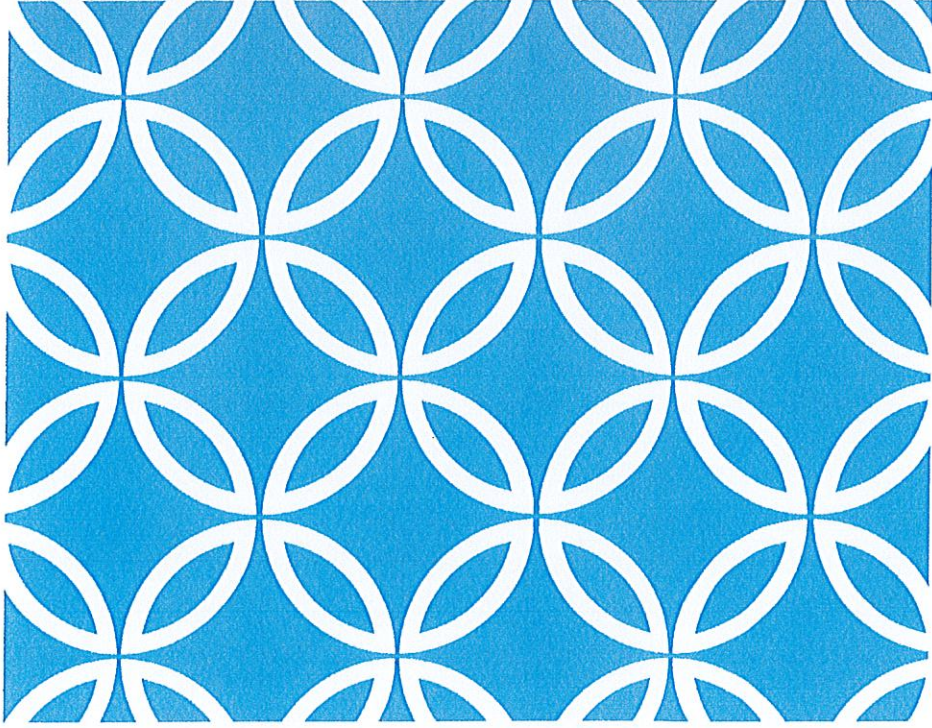

52010 Printing and Office Supplies

\$10,000.00

Explanation: Printing and program promotional information given to those currently incarcerated, mailings, general office supplies.

52040 Wearing Apparel

\$5,000.00

Explanation: We will be utilizing community sources for many needs. However, there are certain things we cannot get donated-such as steel toe work boots-when a participant has a construction job, larger sizes in clothing (sometimes up to 4xl and big and tall men's sizes. We shop for clothing at Goodwill unless it is an item they do not have.

52050 Food/Provisions

\$5,000.00

Explanation: We utilize food pantries as well as donations. However, there are situations on nights, weekends and/or holidays that someone falls outside the realm of the help available. We do basic staple items. Four our homeless clients, there would be items like peanut butter and other non-perishable items.

52911 Small Computer Equipment

\$15,000.00

Explanation: In the Reentry Center, we seek to have not only staff computers and printers/copiers for normal business, but a small computer lab so that during classes etc, clients can have the tools to create a resume, etc. and participate in on-line training.

53010 Professional Services

\$70,000.00

Explanation: We are seeking to contract for Peer Support Specialists in the specific arena of mental health substance abuse as well as general reentrant peers. This would not be a direct contract with individuals-but with organizations.

53030 Utilities

\$7,200.00

Explanation: Utilities for Reentry Center 600/mo x 12 months

53060 Transportation and Travel

\$5,000.00

Explanation: Bus passes/transportation to and from work or other reentry sponsored events for participants.

53140 Rent

\$27,000.00

Explanation:

\$2,250/mo x 12 months

53220 Education and Training

\$45,000.00

Explanation: Various educational opportunities for participants to include those where a "trade" or tuition cost isn't covered by another grant or program. This account would also serve to train officers and other stakeholders on progressive evidence based 'coaching' approaches versus traditional 'case management' or supervision techniques
