The purpose of the Guilford County Sheriff's Office's 2016 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant application is to purchase much needed technology for the Sheriff's Office. With aging computers, the Sheriff's Office seeks to replace these items with tablets to offer greater portability for the officers in the field. With constant, "hold the line" local budgets, this grant proposal will enable the purchase of more current technology for the officers.

Having a portable device such as a tablet enables officers to address issues, answer questions, from citizens or inquire referral information, etc. Operationally, the use of tablets increases the portability of information and enhances the professionalism of officers as they are in the community.

This application seeks to purchase technology (tablets) to replace aging computers within the Guilford County Sheriff's Office. Purchasing a portable device will enable officers the ability to look up information, provide information to citizens etc. This purchase is currently prohibitive under the current budget.
