# MWBE EFFORTS

Samet Corporation put together a project specific nine-page HUB Plan stating a project goal of 25% for the project. The MWBE Plan consist of Samet's Plan, Purpose and Objective, Past Experience, Project MWBE Participation Goals, the Plan Administration, our Research and Investigation of the Guilford County MWBE Market, Active Recruitment Strategy, Contractor's College and Technical Assistance, Tailored Trade Packages, our Financial and Bonding Assistance Program, our Second Tier Strategy approach and Reporting Process to the County.

Samet Corporation also has an active MWBE Protégé Program for the Guilford Behavioral Health Project. The protégé is a local MBE – Gilgeours Construction Lisa Gilgeours. The Protégé has been active all through Preconstruction and will continue through Construction. The Protégé will receive \$37,038.00 for Preconstruction and Construction Services and will gain experience with such things as:

- 1. Assisting with Subcontractor RFIs and Learning how the RFIs are properly posted to the drawings.
- 2. Posting RFI's and updating construction drawings.



- 3. Assisting with the development of Subcontractor Meeting Minutes and handouts for the Weekly Meetings. Learning why this is important
- 4. Working with the Project Engineer on proper documentation during pre-install meetings.
- 5. Learning what is good documentation and what questions to ask
- 6. Assist and learning the Project Closeout process
- 7. Sitting in on Daily Tool Box & Safety Talks
- 8. Working with the Superintendent on scheduling Pre-Install Meetings
- 9. Daily walk of the site with the Superintendent looking at what is considered a problem; what are the solutions and where we are according to schedule
- 10. Assisting with the development of the look ahead schedules and learning how they compare with the overall construction schedule
- 11. Sitting in on all weekly subcontractor meetings
- 12. Making sure the Superintendent is aware of subcontractor schedule impacts and what they plan to do to overcome any weather challenges, etc.
- 13. Develop three weekly look-ahead schedules with Samet Superintendent oversight
- 14. Working closely with the Project Manager on monthly billings and learning the process
- 15. Learning to review subcontractor pay applications
- 16. Making sure MWBE Contractors who are on quick pay are paid accordingly
- 17. Learning what goes into planning for an OAC Meeting
- 18. Reviewing Sales Tax Reports
- 19. Completion of three Month Pay Applications to the Owner with Samet PM oversight
- 20. Watching and learning how material goes in place and what manpower requirements are needed to stay on schedule
- 21. Discussing with the Foreman daily on where they are and what is their expectations for today
- 22. Asking when deliveries are expected and what is needed from Samet
- 23. Discussing work schedules for the week and weekends
- 24. Tracking Project MWBE Participation & Reporting with Diversity Manager

# IV. SCHEDULE STATUS

Bid Package No. 1 - Mobilized onsite 10/21/19. Phase 1 erosion control measures are installed and commencing grading activities.

Bid Package No. 2 – Work to commence following approval of the Final GMP. Anticipate starting foundations mid-January 2020.

# **Outreach Solicitation:**

MWBE Outreach Event - 55 People in Attendance / 14 African American Companies in Attendance

### Phone Call Solicitation:

To increase the African American participation on this project 325 follow up calls were made to State Certified African American Companies. (Please see attached call log and notes – highlighted firms represent phone calls made to Triad firms)

### Email Solicitation:

To increase the African American participation 457 Emails were sent to African American companies. (See Attached Log)

# **Prequalification:**

125 subcontractors prequalified / 21% were African American companies approved to bid a trade package on the project, which equates to 26 available bids to come from African American companies. All African American companies that submitted a prequalification application were approved to bid.

MWBE Participation as a Percentage to Trade Packages Bid Out: 50%

# MBE Firm Percentage: 28%

- (African American- 10%) 9 Companies
- (Hispanic- 12%) 3 Companies
- (Asian American-6%) 1 Company

WBE Firm Percentage: 22% - 8 Companies
