

### **Initial Funding Allocations**

- Total Funding:
  - \$93.7 Million
- Phase 1 allocation: 68 mil
  - Reimbursements: 20 mil
  - Preparedness: 22 mil
  - Lifeline Support: 5mil
  - Business Grants: 20mil
- Phase 2 allocation: 25mil



# Expense Reimbursements for Guilford County

- Phase 1 Allocation: 20.5 Million
- Funding to reimburse eligible expenses already spent responding to COVID-19
  - Eligible Staff Salaries, Overtime, and Benefits
  - COVID-19 Testing Operations
  - Decontamination Costs (Buildings, vehicles, etc.)
  - Personal Protective Equipment Costs
  - Quarantine and Isolation Costs
  - Other Eligible Contract / Equipment Costs
- County is required to use CARES funding prior to FEMA Reimbursement Requests

Phase 1 Allocation: 13 Million

### Mitigation and Preparedness Costs: Governmental Grants

- Phase 1 Allocation: 9.46 million
- Funding for preparedness measures and future impacts of COVID-10
- Excludes any FEMA reimbursable costs
- Pending any future CARES direct funding
- Projects must be pre-approved through Guilford County
- Projects are reimbursable after sufficient documentation and auditing is complete
- All projects completed (cash basis and audited) by December 1, 2020

### Community Lifeline Support

- Phase 1 Allocation: 5 million
- Existing and future costs from non-profit agencies:
  - Non-Profit Social Service Agency Support
  - Care for Homeless Population Support
  - County Fire Department Support







- Phase 1 Allocation: 20 Million
- Grants to Small Business
  - Focus on locally owned, small businesses
  - Online Application Process
  - Maximum 10,000 grant
  - Between 1 25 Employees
  - Gross Receipts on sales less than 1million
  - Must verify costs through the latest tax documents filed
  - Must show a loss due to COVID-19
  - Requires commercial storefront / office space

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
