**REGION 5 MINORITY DIABETES PREVENTION CONTRACT-ALAMANCE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT-\$14,250**

### BACKGROUND

Through a funding agreement with Alamance County Health Department, the Guilford County Department of Health & Human Services - Public Health Division has received an award in the amount of \$14,250 to participate in the Minority Diabetes Prevention Program (MDPP). Public Health will screen potential MDPP participants to ensure they are pre-diabetic, per CDC guidelines, as well as hold educational programs on how to prevent pre-diabetes from turning into diabetes. This program will be a series of sixteen (16) classes that covers healthy eating, active living and encourages a 5%-7% weight loss. This is part of a larger grant from The North Carolina Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities awarded to region 5, which consists of the following local health departments; Alamance, Person, Durham, Orange, Randolph, Guilford, Chatham, Rockingham and Caswell.

Funds will be used for diabetes screenings, advertisement, and education and training.
