

**MINUTES OF BOARD OF COUNTY

The Board of County Commissioners met in a duly noticed regular meeting on May 21, 2026 at 5:30 p.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room, 301 W. Market St., Greensboro; North Carolina.

III. WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Alston welcomed those present and called the meeting to order at 5:36 p.m.

Chairman Alston announced that four speakers are registered for tonight's meeting.

IV. SPEAKERS FROM THE FLOOR

1. Annette Hayes, business owner, thanked the Board for the opportunity in support of Guilford Clean Energy Now. She recognized that the County are leaders in the state and can help set the way for local businesses. She noted the need for global sustainability.
2. Mike Perdue spoke to the tax revaluation and the County Manager's proposed budget. He shared that he was not in support of the recommended budget. He expressed concern regarding affordable housing and the impacts on lower income residents.
3. Ken Orms spoke to his experience living in Chicago. He spoke in opposition to Democratic representation. He spoke to the impacts of high sales tax and property taxes.
4. George Hartzman shared that he believes tax increases contribute to the Board Chair's personal interests.

Mr. Pella Stokes, III thanked the Board for the recognition. He shared that his father instilled in his family, and contributed to others, to not judge people by what they have in their pockets, but what they have in their hearts. He also spoke to the values of hard work and community outreach. He noted that his parents had been married for over 74 years. He extended his mother's thanks to the Board in her absence.

Vice Chairwoman Foster welcomed community members and staff. Guilford County Schools Deputy Superintendent of Business and Operations Dr. Julius Monk introduced the agenda item. He noted the budget amendment to secure the guaranteed maximum price (GMP) for the project.

Commissioner Tillman asked staff to help better understand the costs of Lindley Elementary, which comes in \$25M over Claxton Elementary and \$40M more than Brooks Global.

Dr. Monk noted that there is a four-year difference between bidding on the projects and the building phase that is larger than the other two schools. He noted that \$10M dollars has gone into the sitework for the school, noting that the property has significantly more work to bring the site to one building.

Commissioner Tillman noted that the Board asked for cost efficiencies to be gained in their construction plans. He questioned whether the work being done and the appetite of GCS is to consider savings.

Dr. Monk noted that we are working to build consistency in construction moving forward. He shared that it is something we have done in the past and something that we are planning to do in the future.

Commissioner Tillman spoke to the GMP and noted that it seems to change consistently. He requested staff input.

Dr. Monk noted that we have brought the projects in phases, where we will perhaps do the site work as a GMP and design work separately. He noted that they have had to increase the scope to redesign playgrounds for some of the projects. He noted that this budget is a reduction of \$800K of what was previously scoped out for the site two years ago.

Commissioner Murphy noted that the project ordinance for Katherine Johnson Elementary will have \$10M remaining. She questioned the plans for those funds to zero out that project.

Dr. Monk noted that a portion of that will remain as it was to purchase the land. He noted that there are pieces of property purchases and easements that they will need to retain those funds for.

Motion was made by Vice Chairwoman J. Carlvena Foster, and seconded by Commissioner Mary Beth Murphy, to authorize staff to take any and all necessary actions to amend project ordinances associated with the project readjustments or adopt necessary project ordinances.

County Manager Victor Isler noted the County Manager's Budget Report was included in the Board's packets for review. He shared his gratitude regarding the Greater Greensboro Chamber of Commerce's strong college and business partnerships with the inter-city visit. He noted that the Board's commitment and five-year funding plan help our community college to continue to expand its public-private partnerships.

XII. COMMENTS FROM COMMISSIONERS

Commissioner Murphy offered congratulations to all college graduates.

Commissioner Cooke congratulated some of our young people who have represented Guilford County well in this year's athletic season: including the Northern High School Women's Basketball team, the Dudley HS track and field team for state championships and the Grimsley HS Men's Tennis. She shared her appreciation for our young people who continue to work toward their goals. She shared her attendance at the NCACC regional meeting and the work that the association is doing to advocate in Raleigh. She shared that she and Commissioner Tillman attended this week's Realtor's Association meeting and had great conversations on revaluation and property taxes. She shared that she spent some time with the National Association of Counties' mid-sized county caucus on Zoom today, to discuss nurse navigation services when someone calls 911 as a possible pilot program to support our ambulance resources.

She shared that during the event, the Guilford County Sheriff's Office reviewed the services that they are providing to support mental health care in our community.
